

Recent Actions and Events:

 The Chapter's San Joaquin kit fox workshop was held May 21-23 in Bakersfield. We had 30 attendees, and the event sold out in 10 days. Attendees had several opportunities to view kit foxes, and our classroom instructors included researchers from the Endangered Species Recovery Program, biological consultant, USFWS and DFG regulatory staff, and DFG biologists. The Chapter netted about \$5700 from the event.

Planning:

• We are still planning for the repeat of our small mammals workshop, which we anticipate holding in the latter half of September or early October.

Our next meeting of the Chapter Board is being planned for mid-August.

Past Chapter Activities

- Chapter Meeting(s)
 - **Board meetings** –We have held approximately 4 board meetings this year.
 - Member Socials-- In February, 2012, TWS So Cal Chapter participated in the Western Section Annual Conference in Sacramento. We held a Chapter Meeting to introduce the chapter to the conference attendees. The chapter meeting included a lively discussion with Western Section officers to discuss potential cooperative plans, including a Certification Workshop and training sessions on sensitive species of Southern California.
 - on February 18, TWS So Cal Chapter sponsored a **family BBQ** and birding adventure at Santee Lakes Park, California. The birding expedition was led by local bird expert, Cindy Jones Daverin. Over 40 people attended, including several new members, and all had an opportunity to enjoy good food and camaraderie with the backdrop of a lovely park setting. Biological highlights of the day included: wood ducks, an osprey, and a zone-tailed hawk, mimicking the turkey vultures around it!

Upcoming Chapter Activities

- **Board meetings**—We anticipate 4-6 board meetings this year.
- Upcoming social events-- I am pleased to report that we now have a Chapter Events Coordinator. Callie J. Ford, a Biologist/Environmental Analyst with Dudek Environmental Consultants, has graciously accepted this responsibility and is doing a fine job. Thank you, Callie!
- Plans for 2012/2013 include several options: a Raptor Workshop in early February, 2013, another Hermes Copper Butterfly field trip with David Faulkner (May/June), another family BBQ or two (dates TBD), an Arroyo Toad Workshop (April/May), a spring and/or fall Insect Session (fall and/or spring), and another consultant

company-sponsored event. It would also be good to get **agencies** also involved in sponsoring one or more events. We are happy to report that the **Audubon Society** has indicated an interest in cooperative events. The first one that we are exploring is a lecture and field trip on **Migratory birds**, perhaps at the Carrillo National Monument.

• Ideas for future professional development workshops-- The Chapter's next big event is a Professional Certification Workshop, co-sponsored by the Western Section. This will be held at Dudek's office in Encinitas, CA and we are exploring an off-site (GoTo) option in the Riverside area for more northern participants.

Chapter Focal Points/Issues

- **Goals**—Build membership with continued family-oriented social events and professional opportunities.
- Opportunities/ Constraints—We have a recent opportunity to collaborate with the Audubon Society in some professional development activities. Our constraints continue to be; (1) how busy the potential new members and our volunteer officers are; (2) the challenges of involving members from such a large Chapter area. The extreme north-south area that the Chapter covers is the major challenge along these lines.

Membership

- The **membership** of the TWS SoCal Chapter continues to grow with now over a hundred members. We picked up several new members at each of the events, and some have signed up online, as well.
- Recruitment Efforts—social and professional events and presence/activity at TWS Section and National meetings, as well as word-of-mouth, continue to be our most productive efforts. We also continue to explore way to collaborate with other professional organizations.

The Chapter has donated \$2,000 toward the upcoming National Meeting in Portland.
