

Recent Activities:

- Our annual Natural Communities Conference was held March 28, 2013 and was another great day. We had 17 talks and three posters, and were actually unable to accommodate everyone who wanted to give presentations. It's the first time we had a waiting list for speakers. 129 people were in attendance.
- The Chapter approved sponsorship of a Department of Fish and Wildlife educational effort targeting high school and middle school students in Bakersfield, who will compete by making posters that educate about the issues faced by urban San Joaquin kit foxes. The Chapter's \$1200 donation will cover various levels of awards and prizes to the students who made the winning posters.

Planning:

- Our Blunt-nosed Leopard Lizard workshop will be held May 2-3, 2013, at CSU Bakersfield and at a Department of Fish and Wildlife Ecological Reserve. This workshop sold out within the first day, and the extra spaces we added on the second day sold out immediately.
- The Chapter is in the early stages of planning an Urban Ecology Symposium in Fresno during the fall. We are looking into conference space at Fresno State University, and board members are coordinating with Fresno State faculty and other researchers in the Chapter area. It is possible that the event will also expand to include participation by the Association of Environmental Professionals.

Financial Standing

- We are almost done reconciling the accounting for the Natural Communities Conference. Including the revenue from that event, we will have about \$37,900 in our two bank accounts.

Meetings:

 The Chapter Board met last on March 28, 2013 following the Natural Communities Conference in Bakersfield. We are planning a meeting for midsummer that will likely be a retreat at Shaver Lake.

- Late spring/early summer 2014 date TBD. Camping trip to Mojave NP with Neal Darby of NPS


