## Willow Flycatcher - Great Gray Owl Workshop

This workshop will focus on the status, biology, and ecology of willow flycatcher and great gray owls in the Central Sierra Nevada region of California. This 2-day workshop will be geared towards natural resource planners, foresters, biologists, and others who are responsible for the conservation of these species, or identifying habitats on the ground and conducting surveys related to land management activities.

The workshop will take place in Truckee, California, and consist of both classroom and field components. This two-day workshop will cover status, ecology, demography, life history, distribution, conservation, modeling and research, and basic identification (visual and vocal), of willow flycatchers and great gray owls. Discussion will also focus on ecology and management of mountain meadow ecosystems. We will spend the first day in lecture, and the second day visiting field sites to identify habitat and review survey techniques.
